STATEMENT ON THE DEATH OF POPE FRANCIS

To the Catholic community, and all people of good will in Victoria,

On Easter Monday, Pope Francis was released from the bondage of this life and born into eternal life in Christ. Here in Victoria, the leaves are now falling, the bright reds and golds of recent days are now turning to brown and grey. So many of the leaves that once shone on the trees now need to be racked up and composted. Autumn this year was brilliant, but not long lasting. In this life, all things pass.

This year, all Christian traditions are united in celebrating the season of Easter together, the time when we celebrate the victory of life over death, of love over hate, and of the light over darkness.
